One thing I show every ethics class is a documentary called *The Falling Man*. It is about a reporter's attempt to identify the man who became the poster child for the jumpers. We get into issues like maintaining the authenticity of experiencing and airbrushing unpleasant, upsetting, or contrary things out of history.

The students notice the section where the coroner's office says that nobody jumped, despite the comments from the family members. We also talk about privacy, accuracy, exploiting trauma victims, serving the public, and whatever else the students wish to mention.
